**THE OFFICE OF THE PEOPLE’S COUNSEL FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA’S
MOTION FOR ENLARGEMENT OF TIME IN THE ABOVE MATTER**

Pursuant to Rule 105.8 of the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia’s (“Commission” or “PSC”) Rules of Practice and Procedure, the Office of the People’s Counsel for the District of Columbia (“OPC”) respectfully requests an enlargement of time in the above-captioned proceeding.

In support of this Motion, OPC states the following:

1. On September 24, 2025, the Hearing Officer, Noel Antonio by email requested briefs by the parties on the question of the disputed amount of credit due to Rebecca Levinson (“Ms. Levinson”) by the Potomac Electric Power Company (Pepco) based on her solar generation. In his email, Mr. Antonio assigned a deadline of November 17, 2025, for OPC’s brief and December 15, 2025, for Pepco’s response. Since Mr. Antonio’s email, Pepco has produced more than a thousand pages of data to be reviewed by the parties in response to OPC’s data requests. On Wednesday, November 5, the parties met virtually to discuss narrow technical questions that have a direct impact on the calculations involved in Ms. Levinson’s complaint. Several follow-up questions remain outstanding.
2. OPC respectfully requests an extension until December 5 to file its brief.
3. This request is made in good faith and not for the purpose of delay. Additional time is necessary to allow the parties to discuss complex data outside of a formal meeting with the Hearing Officer.

WHEREFORE, OPC respectfully requests that the Commission grant this Motion and extend the deadline to Friday, December 5, 2025, to provide a day and time for an informal hearing.
